Mapping the School-to-Prison Pipeline 101 – The Basics

The excessive use of exclusionary punishment in recent decades, as well as "zero-tolerance" school policies has triggered a cascade of system-driven consequences that channel young people into the prison system - what has come to be called the "School-to-Prison Pipeline." Tia will outline the evidence of these consequences, and show how the school-to-prison pipeline anchors an intergenerational cycle that disproportionately channels the sons of incarcerated men into the prison pipeline as well. She will conclude with identifying some potential points of intervention and new approaches to disrupt this negative cycle. Tia Martinez has over 25 years' experience doing social change work in the United States. She has a BA in History from Harvard University, a Masters in Public Policy from the University of California, Berkeley, and a JD from Stanford Law School.
